MUSEUM OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION

After a snowy first attempt the Chapters' trip to the Museum of the American Revolution occurred on Saturday, February 10,

2024. 15 members of the chapter and associate member, Janet Maher, State American History

Washington's War Tent



Philadelphia. The Museum, opened in 2017 is designed as a walking tour through the timeline of the Revolution. Beginning on the second floor and starting in the rooms to the right you first encounter "Tearing down the King".

As you walk through the circular designed path to the new nation, there are many interactive displays that teach all aspects of the year from 1760 to the ratification of the Constitution in 1788. The Washington's War Tent Experience was the highlight of the day for many of us. Learning that General Washington's tent is still with us and so beautifully preserved was amazing! Did you know that we almost lost it during the Civil War as it was owned at the time by Robert E. Lee's wife, Mary Anna Custis Lee, great granddaughter of Martha Washington. Selina Norris Gray, the enslaved housekeeper of the Lee's protected the tent and other artifacts owned by Washington, when Arlington House was attached by the Union. Our day ended with fellowship and

food as we lunched at Big Fish Grill on the Waterfront on our way home. Thanks to the

2024 Christina River Watershed Cleanup

Saturday April 13th starting at 8:00 AM



It is that time of year again to mark our calendars for the Christina River Watershed

Cleanup! How does so much trash end up in the oceans? Much of it travels along the path of fresh water downhill and into the oceans by way of rivers.

The Christina River Watershed includes beautiful rolling hills, farms and forests, and large and small towns. But litter, dropped or dumped by anyone, can travel the Brandywine, White Clay, and Red Clay Creeks, and Christina River before continuing into the Delaware River. This watershed provides more than 75% of the water supply for residents and businesses in New Castle County, Delaware.

The Christina River Watershed Cleanup's mission has always been the removal of manmade debris from within this beautiful watershed, while raising public awareness for pollution prevention. Since the Cleanup began in 1992, more than 360 tons of tires, appliances, household items, and other trash have been cleared from within the watershed.

There will be a DAR team that will meet early on April 13th at the historic Hale Byrnes House to pick up trash, bag it and move it to a pickup point nearby. Sadly, this area is known as a heavy trash site. We can use your help; bring your family including husbands, teenagers for community service hours, etc.

Here are the specific details you need to know! Our DAR team will meet at the Hale Byrnes House, 606 Stanton Christiana Rd, Newark, DE 19713, at 8:00 AM (because of the tides) to pick up trash until about 11:00 AM. It will be led by Sarah O'Donnell, State and Cooch's Bridge Conservation Chair. This event is **rain or shine** so dress for the weather and wear boots. Trash bags, some tools and gloves will be available, but you may want to wear your favorite garden gloves. DID YOU KNOW that the below activities ALL count as Service to America hours:

- Volunteering at local historical societies or associations
- Volunteering in schools, hospitals, and churches
- Volunteering with other lineage societies outside of DAR
- Transporting or sitting with those facing medical issues (non-family members)
- Service as a DAR chapter / C.A.R. senior society, state or national officer; committee chairman, vice chairman, cochairman, committee member, etc. This includes all planning, communication, board meetings, and committee meetings.

If you need help logging hours, or are unsure if your hours count, please contact Valarie.

*That is 30 hours per member for the year and is also based on the # of members on January 1, 2024. The goal for this year, with 25 members (so far), the hours will be 750.

What's a QUORUM? And why should you care

Our by-laws state that a quorum is 50% + 1 of our membership. We have 25 members as of January 1, 2024 and our quorum is 13.

A quorum is the minimum number of members that must be present at any of its meetings to make the proceedings of that meeting valid. A meeting quorum is required at our chapter meetings for the purpose of conducting and voting on new chapter business. Without it we can't make motions, change bylaws, initiate group projects, purchase items, donate money, and so forth. Please plan to attend as many meetings as possible so we can meet the quorum needed to achieve our chapter goals.



OPERATION PAPERBACK

Operation Paperback is a national, non-profit organization, whose volunteers collect gently-

used books and send them to American troops overseas, as well as veterans and military families here at home. Since 1999, we have shipped over 2.9 million books to countries all over the world (shown in orange on the adjacent map).

Step 1 – Collect

The following genres are most frequently requested: action, bestsellers, biographies and memoirs, fantasy, history, horror, mysteries, science-fiction, true crime. Do NOT send romance novels unless specifically requested by the individual!

Our troops have received a disproportionate amount of this genre and they aren't very happy about it.

Step 2 - Sort

Weed out any books that do not meet the standards of our program. Do NOT send:

- Ripped, stained, molding, damaged materials
- Religious material unless specifically requested (pamphlets and bookmarks included)
- Out of date items (ex. your uncle's map collection)

Remember that your package is a gift meant to entertain our troops and veterans! Take pride in what you send and don't be shy about pitching unsuitable materials into your recycling bin.

Then sort your books by genre. Also sort by hardcover/paperback. Overseas addresses receive paperbacks only. Domestic addresses can receive both hardcovers and paperbacks.

- 3. If you would like to make a donation to defray the cost of the meeting, click the Patronage Level of your choice. Click "Continue".
- 4. *****Complete the "Registration Information (Required)" section *****. This includes your name, email address, Chapter name, offices/committees (if any), whether you are a voter, and whether you have a name tag. It is essential that this section is completed.
